Poke in the eye for pirates Gunfire was exchanged early on Thursday morning, when Somali pirates tried to hijack a Spanish naval patrolling off the Horn of Africa. Using assault rifles, the pirates attacked the warship ESPS Patino, which is serving as the flagship for the European Union's fleet of ships. The ship's crew immediately returned fire, forcing the pirates off the hull they were attempting to climb and back into their tiny boat.



Realizing they were outnumbered, they attempted to escape, dumping their weapons overboard. But they were tracked by the Patino's helicopter and eventually surrendered. Five of six suspected pirates detained on the ship were injured and two required medical treatment, according to EU Navfor Somalia. There are unconfirmed reports that one of the pirates was killed. In a statement, the EU's anti-piracy force command said: 'The suspected pirates opened fire with light caliber weapons and tried to board the Patino,' The ship's force-protection team returned fire in self-defense and the ship's helicopter was launched. The skiff broke off the attack and the men surrendered to the helicopter after throwing their weapons, ladder and fuel barrels overboard.



The Spanish warship had just finished as an escort to a food aid ship which was headed to the Somali capital of Mogadishu. In addition to a counter-piracy effort, the main mission of the fleet is to escort and protect freighters carrying food from the World Food Program. According to naval force spokesman Harrie Harrison, EU counter-piracy forces, which began their mission in December 2008, hadn't used weapons against pirates until yesterday. The last known incident of gunfire involved the U.S. Navy and took place 'a few years ago,' Mr Harrison told Bloomberg. The men opened fire and tried to board the vessel because it was dark and they had not realized it was a naval vessel suggested Mr Harrison. 'The suspect pirates would have seen it looked like a large ship and gone for it,' he said.

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The Real Meaning...

PLASTIKI, THE SHIP MADE FROM 12,000 PLASTIC BOTTLES SETS SAIL



A boat constructed mainly of plastic soda bottles named the PlastikI (A no doubt take-off on the famous Kon-tiki) This craft is supposed to set sail across the mighty Pacific Ocean. The vessel was reportedly constructed of 12,000 plastic two liter bottles, which have been pressurized using dry ice powder, making it buoyant enough to carry four people on the 11,000 miles from San Francisco to Sydney. The Scheduled trip is slated to take at least one hundred sea days. Electricity and propulsion will also be using solar, panels, wind turbines and crew exercise bikes.
