A New Kind of Piracy



With Ninety Percent of global commerce traveling by ship and so many of our ships, ports, and infrastructure being automated a concern over securing the computer systems operating these items has been identified. In response, the United States Coast Guard has formed the USCG Cyber Command in order to assess this new type of threat to our ports and ships and ensure the safety of US commerce. The American Association of Port Authorities is among the trade groups taking the lead on the issue. It held a Cyber Security Webinar in January to discuss initiatives and best practices that included presentations by the Coast Guard's Cyber Command and TSA's Cyber Security Awareness and Outreach teams. To be sure, securing this infrastructure must be a priority in today's evolving warfare and certainly will become the future of attacks as we know them. Nautical Word of the Month:

Piping:

Boatswains have been in charge of the deck force since the days of sail. Setting sails, heaving lines, and hosting anchors required coordinated team effort and boatswains used whistle signals to order the coordinated actions. When visitors were hoisted aboard or over the side, the pipe was used to order "Hoist Away" or "Avast heaving." In time, piping became a naval honor on shore as well as at sea.
